Supplies

- Card stock for card (8.5 x 4.25), folded in half
- Envelope (size A2, to fit folded card)
- Red (or pink or white) card stock, 2 pieces (8.5 x 11)
- Yellow card stock (5 x 5)
- White card stock (2 x 2, or if using white for the flower, you'll have enough)
- Piece of ribbon (12 inches)
- Paper glue
- Bone folder
- Scissors

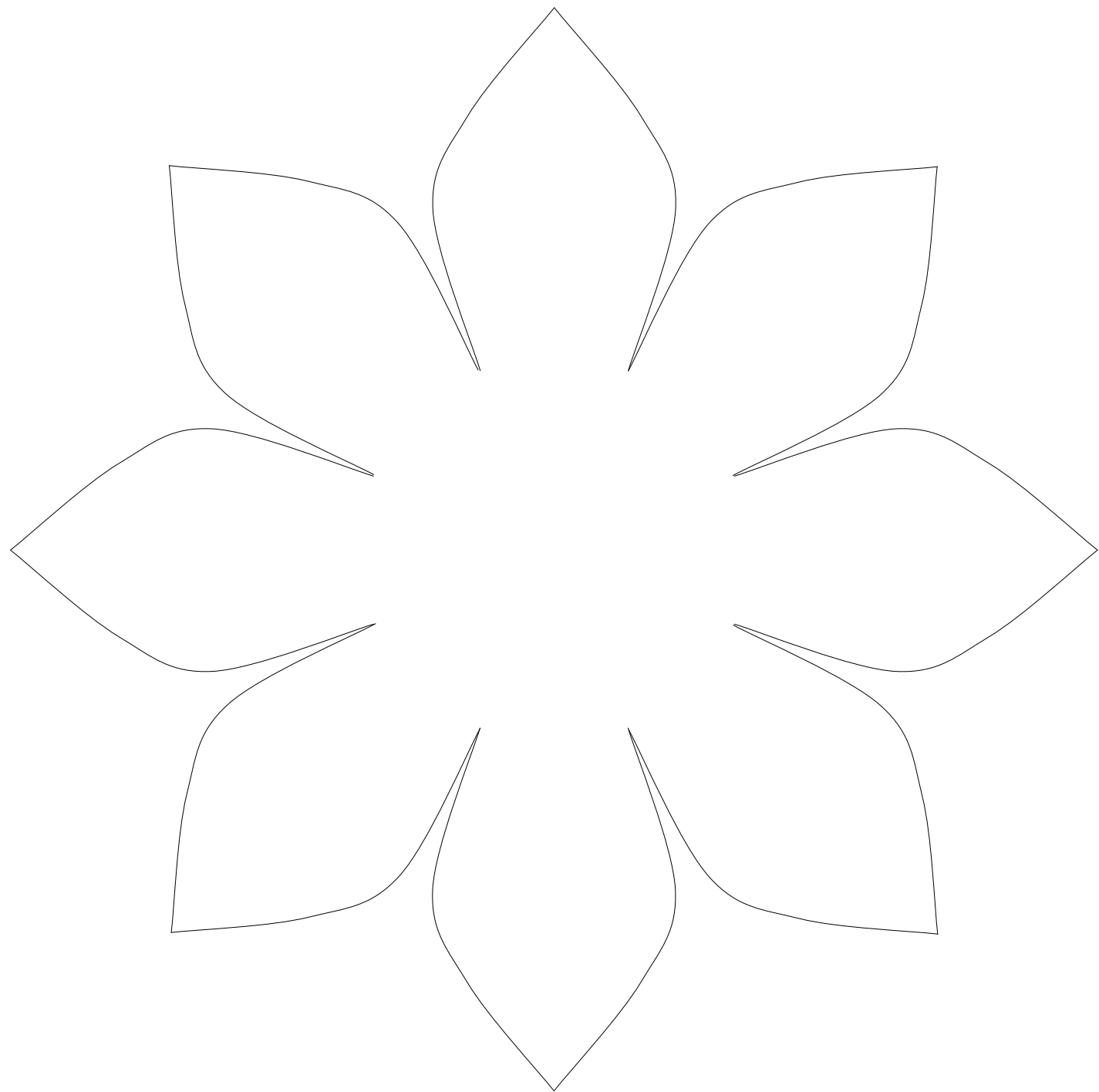
Instructions

1. Using the templates on the following pages, trace the flower parts and the center circle onto card stock. (Use red, pink, or white for the petals; yellow for the stamens; and white for the circle.)
2. Cut each part out carefully, making sure to **completely** cut away all of the lines.
3. Center all pieces (in the following order: large petals, small petals, stamens, circle) and glue each in place.
4. Fold the stamens in toward the center, then the smaller petals, and finally the larger petals.
5. Center the piece of ribbon on the back of the folded flower and glue in place. Bring the ends around to the front and tie in a bow on the front of the folded flower
6. Center the folded flower (with attached ribbon) on the front of the card and glue in place.
7. Unfold the flower and write a greeting in the center of the circle, and write a note on the inside of the card.
8. Refold and retie the ribbon before inserting the card into the envelope.

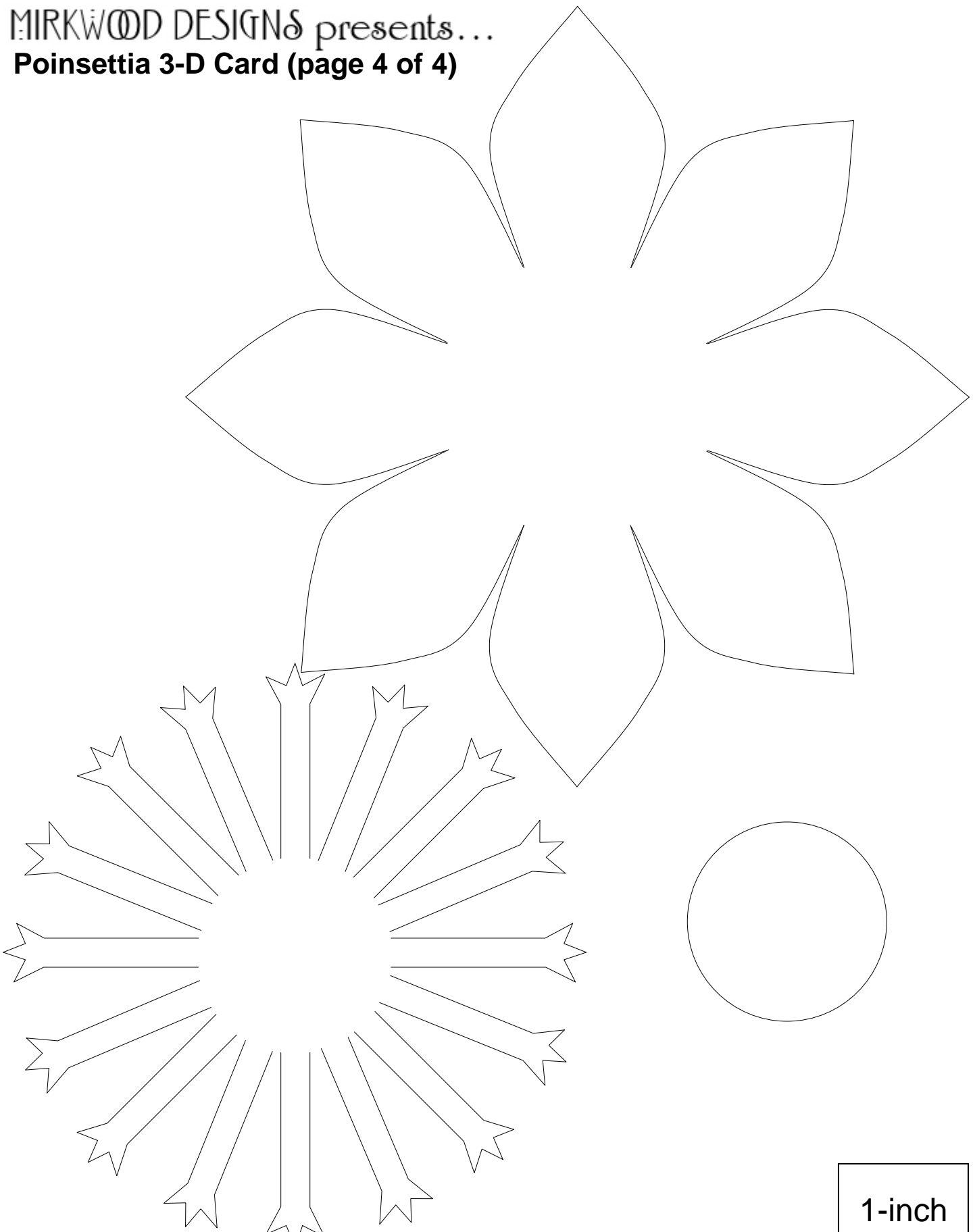
Note: Check with your post office to determine correct postage because this card is bulky.

Idea: You can also use just the flower and ribbon as a gift tag! Just write the recipient's name in the center circle.
