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


Hanging Snowflake (page 2 of 2)

Supplies

- White paper (inexpensive 8.5 X 11-inch printer paper is just right)
- Bone folder
- Sharp scissors
- White sewing thread (or thin fishing line)
- Transparent tape (such as Scotch-brand tape)

Instructions

1. Cut the paper in half so that it measures 8.5 x 5.5 inches.
2. Fold the paper into an accordion making 8 segments (folded it will measure 1.12 x 5.5 inches). (Figure 1)
3. Fold the accordion in half lengthwise.
4. Cut away a small segment from each side of the fold. The cuts must be symmetrical. (Figure 2)
5. Tie a piece of thread around the middle and unfold the last fold (the accordion should still be folded). (Figure 3)
6. Start making symmetrical cuts on each side of the accordion. (Figure 3)
7. When you are satisfied with the cuts, carefully unfold the accordion folds and use tiny pieces of tape to secure each side. Trim away any tape that sticks out.
8. Bring the piece of thread up along one of the inside folds and secure with a piece of tape.



Ideas: Make a larger snowflake by starting with a piece of legal paper (8.5 x 14 inches).
Add glitter to your snowflakes.

Use very thin paper and make more accordion folds.

If the snowflakes make you cold, make a sun by using yellow paper instead of white!
